

RECORDITOR

Operational Manual v1

The name Recorditor is mash up of the words “Recorder” and “Editor”.
Recorder allows you to edit what you are recording *while* you are recording.

INSTALLATION:

Recorditor is a standalone app. However its function requires the ReWire component within Pro Tools. The installer will put the Recorditor app in your “Applications” folder, as well as the RecorditorReWireDevice in your *Mac HD/Library/Application Support/Propellerhead Software/ReWire* folder.

After a successful installation, and rebooting Pro Tools, you should be able to see *RecorditorReWireDevice* plugin in the *Instruments* section of the plugins list.

Besides ReWire, the app also requires OSX authorization to enable accessibility options in your system preferences.

LICENSE AUTHORIZATION:

Upon launching Recorditor, you will be presented with an authorization window. To try Recorditor, simply click TRY and continue with entering your iLok account information.

If you already purchased Recorditor, you'll need to redeem your license code within iLok license manager and activate the license asset to your iLok USB key.

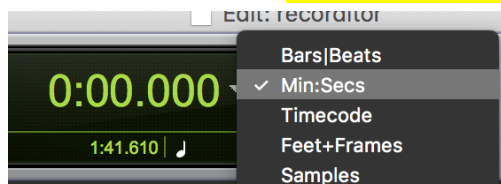
OPERATION:

Recorditor is designed to work alongside Pro Tools during scripted or non-scripted, continuous voice, dialog or music recordings. It allows you to make edit decisions on the fly and then performs these decisions by deleting or muting unwanted takes automatically.

Step by step operation guide:

1- Create a Pro Tools session with at least one Audio Track and an Aux track.

2- Set session time to **Minutes and Seconds**.

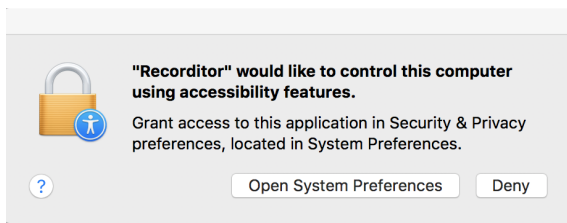


3- Instantiate RecorditorRewireDevice on the Aux track (found under Instruments).



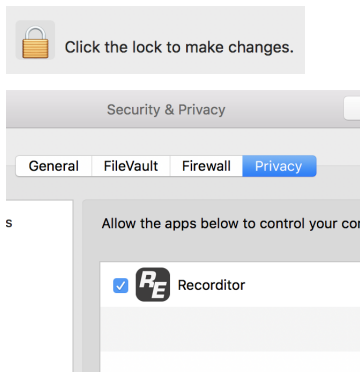
You don't need to select any output.

4- Open Recorditor if you haven't done so. (if it's the first time, Accessibility authorization window should be presented. Click "Open System Preferences and grant Recorditor authorization in the Accessibility preferences of OSX.



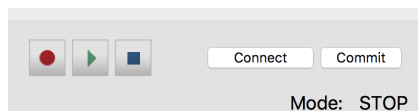
(FYI: The System Preference pane might open behind Recorditor main window.)

TIP: You will have to click the padlock and enter admin info to unlock and make changes in the next window.

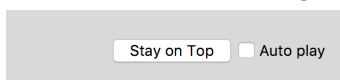


Then click the box next to Recorditor to allow access.

5- Go back to Recorditor and click Connect.



We recommend clicking "Stay on Top" to keep Recorditor window always in the front.

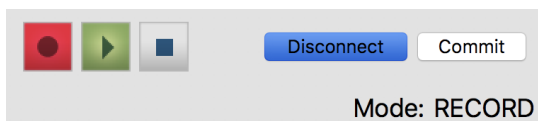


6- Click the Record button on **Recorditor** transport to get *Pro Tools* transport into record ready (Pro Tools record button on the transport should flash red). **Do not use** Pro Tools transport to do this, otherwise the communication will be asynchronous.

7- When you are ready to record, you need to **record-arm** the track within ProTools.



8- Go back and click Play on Recorditor transport. Pro Tools will go into record. Now click on the Recorditor window to make it active again, and you should see the two transport buttons lit up like this:



9- During recording, stay on Recorditor window and use the arrow keys to mark the takes. **Left arrow** will mark the take as a **bad** take, and **Right arrow** will mark the take as a **good** take. You can type comments for the takes and even change their decision from delete to keep (command + 1), keep to delete (command + 2) etc. while recording.

10- After recording is finished, click on the marker locations to review them and edit their status. You can use autoplay, or spacebar/transport to start playback from markers. You can drop markers in between other markers during Playback.

11- To apply all the edits, click the Commit button. The spinning ball will appear until all the edits have been applied to Pro Tools timeline.

TIP: Before committing, we recommend you to duplicate, deactivate, and hide the record track in case you need to refer to the un-edited version.

12- You can make new versions within the session if so desired. Please note, new versions will always start recording from session start.
